The Council of Energy Research and Education Leaders (CEREL) of the National Council for Science and the Environment (NCSE) is now ready to accept abstracts for talks at the 2nd **National Energy Education Summit**, which will take place June 7, 2016 at American University in Washington DC. The Summit will immediately precede the annual conference of the Association for Environmental Studies and Sciences (AESS) <http://aess.info> from June 8-11 at American University. We encourage Summit participants to remain for the AESS conference.

The purpose of the Summit is to engage energy educators in all sectors, including K-12, higher education and public education in sharing best practices and developing partnerships, in order to expand the impact and effectiveness of energy education. The Summit will cover *what* we teach in energy education, *how* we teach it, how we can collaborate to teach it better, and *how* we can overcome critical challenges. The Summit will include up to 5 talks in each topic area, followed by a group discussion on a common vision, effective practices and next steps in topic area.
